Objectives:

- Explain why premature babies and neonates with prolonged NICU stay are at high risk for behavioral and emotional problems.
- Recognize critical aspects of maternal mental health and wellbeing and its impact on children's social and emotional development
- Identify and apply strategies that support social and emotional development in the NICU and during the first years of life after discharge.
- Incorporate in your practice strategies to improve working relationships with parents and caregivers.

<u>Goal</u>: To bring together health care providers and educators from different backgrounds to discuss behavioral and emotional problems in children born prematurely and identify ways in which to help their families.
